Judy Weber of Laguna Niguel, California, has been a professional educator since 1986. Weber has taught in high-poverty schools and in a hybrid charter school with students in the classroom two days a week and in the virtual classroom three days a week, with curriculum, assessments, and student records delivered via technology.

Weber is involved in an ongoing initiative sponsored by TEAMwork for Quality Living, a community effort to eliminate poverty using Bridges Out of Poverty along with mentoring and circles of support. She also served as a TopHat Mentor in a collaboration between the Indiana Department of Education and Mid-Continent Research for Education and Learning (McREL) to support the implementation of research-based, effective practices in low-performing schools.

As a board member of the Indiana Staff Development Council, Weber was instrumental in developing the Gold Star Award, an award focused on effective teaching practice and professional development to increase student academic performance. Weber was awarded the Christa McAuliffe Fellowship in 1998 and is a 1999 graduate of the National Staff Development Academy.

As an educational consultant for aha! Process since 2002, Weber has served as a presenter, a mentor to schools engaged in long-term implementation of Dr. Payne's A Framework for Understanding Poverty, and coordinator of Dr. Ruby Payne's National Tour and Framework and Bridges Trainer Certification workshops.
