Sherman Bradley of Cincinnati, Ohio, is the founder of Consider the Poor (CTP), a consulting, advocacy, training, and service company focused on breaking the cycle of poverty. CTP sponsors the HopeFest Health and Education Festival for families in poverty, serving thousands in partnership with the University of Cincinnati, the City of Cincinnati, Children's Hospital Medical Center, businesses, churches, organizations, and volunteers. At this annual event, extensive data have been collected on the healthcare practices of families in poverty.

Bradley formerly served as vice president of City Gospel Mission, Cincinnati's oldest homeless shelter. He has been a certified Bridges Out of Poverty trainer since 2008, and he is a Getting Ahead facilitator. He also trains and consults through CTP, focusing on helping the middle and upper classes understand how they can better assist those in poverty.

Bradley is a board member of Social Venture Partners, a graduate of Leadership Cincinnati, a former member of Rotary International, co-chair of the Mosaix Network, and a member of Toastmasters International.

Bradley is a U.S. Air Force veteran and co-pastor, with his wife Sadell, of New Life Covenant Cincinnati, a multi-ethnic, intergenerational, and multiclass congregation. He is the father of Whitney, Shaniqua, and Robert and the grandfather of Jaxon and Robert, Jr.
