Working in the field of language development has broadened Bein's interest in communication. She has written and published a program for families of children with articulation delay.

Bein's master's degree in speech pathology has led to international experiences. She studied in France and worked in Bosnian and Romanian orphanages, providing staff training and therapy for children with special needs. She is often called upon to provide expertise for local magazines, newspapers, and other news media. She collaborates with several community agencies, including the Children First program, Sooner Start early intervention program, Tulsa Community Service Council, and local schools and libraries. She is fluent in American Sign Language and is working toward certification in auditory verbal therapy.
